Rules & Regulations – Equestrian Canada

The Central Classic at Essa Trillium Shows are EC Sanctioned Silver/Bronze competitions under Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sports 2451 Riverside Dr, Ottawa ON K1H 7X7 and are governed by the rules of EC.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equestrian Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities. · Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subject to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which the conduct or treatment of horses will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane. A medical attendant will be present at each THJA-GBZ show. A veterinarian and blacksmith will be on call.

(A102.9) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

(A602.2) Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC Rules and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book all questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

(A602.4) Canadian entries are required to hold both an EC Horse Recording Number and have paid the Horse Recording Annual Activation fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport license hold, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404)

(A602.5) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.

(Appendix A1) "Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the **Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP)** and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details

(A602.7) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC, and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals' participation in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any other additional rules imposed by the competition.

(A602.8) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.

Rules & Regulations: Administration

STALL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE after being booked.

Entries are to be completed online at www.eqshowmanager.com Entries are due 7 days before the horse show to avoid a post entry fee.

All entries must have a complete name and addresses for riders and owners, their respective EC (Silver or Bronze Memberships), OE and THJA numbers, horse recording numbers and **Trainer's Name, Contact Information and EC Membership Number**. *Management reserves the right to refuse an entry, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitor at its discretion.*

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide proof of all necessary memberships numbers (Equestrian Canada (Silver/Bronze), Ontario Equestrian and Trillium Hunter Jumper Association) for rider, owner, and horse.

EC Temporary Sport Licences & Horse Recording Numbers: Are no longer available to be purchased in the show office. Competitors, Owners and Coaches are responsible for purchasing the correct level of EC membership and provide proof, if requested. Failure to have the correct level of EC membership (that the horse is being shown in - Bronze or Silver) may result in not being able to compete at the show. EC memberships should be purchased through the individual's My EC Account.

Memberships for HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER MUST be purchased in order to compete at an event. Failure to comply with this can result in fines from Equestrian Canada for both the event and the competitor/owner and not being allowed to compete at the show.

Show Schedule: Show management reserves the right to change or amend show schedules up to one hour prior to the designated class. Show management reserves the right to combine divisions at any time. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes or divisions in an effort to adhere to the timetable.

Competitor numbers will **NOT** be issued without full payment, or a signed open cheque left with the show secretary to cover all charges and fees incurred by the exhibitor. Competition Numbers must be worn and visible at all times when mounted on a horse.

Outstanding accounts: Any outstanding account for Two Stride Show Management for the Central Classic at Essa Trillium Shows must be paid in full before an entry can be accepted and processed. All accounts must be settled before the next show, otherwise, entries will be denied at the next show, and no points awarded. *****Please note that any outstanding accounts at year-end will not be eligible to receive year-end awards.**

Scratched Entries: Scratched entries will pay the full Scratch Fee (\$30) plus the Administrative Fee if the scratched entry is received before the start of the hunter division or the jumper/equitation class. Failure to do this will result in **FULL ENTRY FEES BEING CHARGED.**

Hor Concours: Will not be permitted.

Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. **All competitors must be able to show the proof of vaccinations upon request and vaccinations certificates for horses can be uploaded directly onto the ESM site.**

Veterinarian and/or Farrier bills incurred at the horse show (medical emergencies, farm calls, etc.) must be settled preferably the day the costs are incurred, but no later than 2 weeks after the event. All unpaid bills to the series "On-call Veterinarian" will result in an outstanding account for the competitor, thus the competitor will not be able to compete at any other Central Trillium show until the account has been paid in full.

Stabling is limited and must be arranged directly with the individual show facility. Cross ties are not permitted in aisle ways. Stable request forms **MUST** be sent into **15 days** before the show to twostrideshowmgmt@gmail.com Phone or Online stall requests **WILL NOT** be considered received without the Stall Request Form, which is available for download online at www.twostride.ca.

Stall Cleaning Fee - A \$60.00 + HST fee will be charged to ALL exhibitors whose stall is not cleaned before departure of the show.

Facility/Medic Fee - \$35.00/horse. This fee covers extra precautionary measures set in place to keep our people and competitors safe throughout day-to-day operations during competitions.

NSF cheques - \$50.00 bank penalty charges will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.

Campers – Free. NO HOOK-UPS available.

Ribbons - Ribbons are the responsibility of the competitor, not show management. Ribbons will be available via presentation or at the ingate any time on the SAME DAY of competition ONLY. Ribbons will not be held. Please do not collect ribbons that do not belong to you.

Amateur Ruling:

ARTICLE G108 Amateur Status

1. All Seniors competing in amateur classes at EC sanctioned competitions must possess a current EC amateur card, which is purchased annually at the price listed in the EC Schedule of Fees. Competitors in FEI sanctioned competitions must comply with the FEI definition of amateur.
2. A person competing in an EC amateur class must hold a valid EC senior sport license, have a current amateur card, and adhere to the following guidelines:
 - a) An EC amateur may hold an EC Instructor Beginner Certificate and teach within the context of the Instructor Beginner Certificate.
 - b) An EC amateur may accept remuneration for the instruction or coaching of the disabled.
 - c) An EC amateur may not accept remuneration for training a horse or for riding a horse at any EC sanctioned competition.
 - d) An EC amateur may not accept remuneration for coaching any person to ride or drive a horse, including riding or driving clinics and seminars (See article G108 2.a for exemption)
 - e) An EC amateur may not train or show a horse or instruct a rider or driver when remuneration for this activity is given to a corporation or farm which he or she or his or her family owns or controls.
 - f) An EC amateur may not act as an agent nor accept commissions for the sale, purchase, and/or lease of a horse.
 - g) EC amateurs may not use their name, photograph or any form of personal association as a horse person in connection with any advertisement or article sold without the approval and the signature of EC (e.g. product endorsement or advertisement of their activity as a coach).
 - h) An EC amateur may not enter into any form of the sponsorship agreement. This is in conflict with the provisions of this article. See division rules for further information governing amateur status within divisions.
 - (i) Persons who have not engaged in any of the activities in Article G108 (2 a, g) during the preceding two (2) calendar years may request reinstatement as amateur competitors.
3. Application for EC amateur status:
Amateur Status is issued by EC
 - a) For EC members, certification of amateur status is issued annually on EC sport license cards.
 - b) All people wishing EC amateur status must complete and sign the amateur declaration, which is on the
 - c) sport license application/renewal form, affirming their eligibility.Eligible amateurs who are not members of EC may receive amateur status issued by EC upon payment of fees listed in the current EC fee schedule.

Temporary Sport Licences for 2026

Temporary Sport Licences for Competitors will no longer be issued by the Show Office. ALL riders, owners, and coaches MUST hold at minimum a Bronze Sport Licence (exceptions only in Article A213) and must be purchased on the individual's My EC Portal.

REMINDER: If you are showing in Silver Rated Divisions at our shows the rider and owner MUST hold Silver EC memberships in order to accumulate points towards the Trillium Championships

Temporary Horse Recording will NO LONGER BE AVAILABLE IN 2025. Horses showing in Silver Rated Divisions and higher are required to have a HORSE RECORDING NUMBER purchased from Equestrian Canada in order to be eligible for points for both the Trillium Championships and Zone Year End Awards and not incur fees from Equestrian Canada.

Memberships for HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER MUST be purchased in order to compete at an event. Failure to comply with this can result in fines from Equestrian Canada for both the event and the competitor/owner and not being allowed to compete at the show.

EC Coach Status Requirements for 2026

Minimum coaching requirements will be validated for all entries at EC-sanctioned events (ARTICLE A602):

- Canadian coaches must hold a minimum *Licensed EC Coach Status* to coach at an EC-sanctioned competition.
- Registered coaches, coaches listed as "Pending", "Expired", or with no status must purchase Temporary Coach Status.
- Athletes may declare themselves to be Self-Coached by entering their own name and EC Sport Licence in the trainer fields made available on the entry form.

Attention Sport Licence Holders and Coaches in Competition,

Are you planning to attend EC-sanctioned events this year as a competitor or a coach? Now is the time to ensure you are fully show-ready! Your **Sport Licence, Horse Recordings** and **FEI documents** must be current and valid for the 2026 competition season before you head to a show.

Coaches in competition are reminded to apply for, or renew, their EC Licensed Coach status before the season begins. If you do not hold **Licensed Coach** status, you must hold a valid **Registered Coach** status to be able to purchase the online Single Event Coach Status upgrade through your MyEC account. **The \$55/event Coach status upgrade applies only to Registered Coaches working toward Licensed Coach status (regardless of competition date, discipline or location.)**

Coaches at EC competitions who do not have valid Coach Status (Licensed, or Registered + the single event upgrade) will be subject to a fine per event. No valid Coach Status = not eligible to coach at EC Sanctioned Events. See the Coaching Compliance Section of the Schedule of Fines and Penalties.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

Division & Class Specifications

SILVER HUNTER DIVISIONS

Small Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'3"

Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh. Small pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Medium Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'6"

Open to ponies exceeding 12.2 hh but not exceeding 13.2 hh. Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Large Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1st of the competition year.

Modified Pony Hunter

Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3" below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1. *Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other classes or divisions requiring them to jump with the exception of the Modified Pony Medal and their age respective equitation on the flat.*

Small – Not to exceed 2'

Medium – Not to exceed 2'3"

Large – Not to exceed 2'6"

Every pony entered in a pony division must have a valid Equestrian Canada pony measurement on file with Equestrian Canada. USEF pony measurement cards are also acceptable.

Short Stirrup Division: Fences not to exceed 21" (Verticals Only)

Open to "C" riders. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Limited Division: Riders may not enter any other classes except for "C" Equitation on the flat and My First Medal. Riders in the under-saddle class must be short stirrup eligible.

Adult Amateur Hunter Division: Fences 3'

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. **Open to horses and large ponies. Distances will not be adjusted.**

A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2).

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

2'9" Adult Amateur Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"

Open to horses and large ponies. Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2). Limited Division: A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the 2'6"/2'9" low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 adult medal, and adult equitation on the flat class.

2'3"/2'6" Low/High Adult Amateur Hunter Division

Open to horses and large ponies. Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6" and under. If also competing in the 2'6"/2'9" low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (low) height. *Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult*

Medal and adult equitation on the flat. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

Junior Divisions - Open to horses ridden by juniors (17 years & under as of 1/1/2026)

2'3"/2'6" Low/High Children's Hunter Division

Open to junior riders on horses and ponies. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. *Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6 and under.* If also competing in the low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6 (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, age-appropriate equitation on the flat and the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Medal. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

2'9" Children's Hunter Division:

Limited Division: A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 children's medal, and age-appropriate equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

Children's Hunter Division: Fences 3'0"

As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

Open Divisions

2'6"/2'9" Low/High Open Hunter Division:

Open to horses and large ponies. Distances will not be adjusted. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior on the same day (G201.2). Limited Division: Horse/rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, hack division, and their age-appropriate equitation on the flat. Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started. *Competitors must declare height on their Championship Show Entry Form.*

Note: 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur Hunter and 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Hunter competitors may only jump at the 2'6" height in this division.

Low Hunter: Fences 3'

Open to all horses and riders.

Trillium Hunter – Low/High: Fences 3'3" and 3'6"

The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. This division is not open to riders competing in the Children's 2'6" and 2'9" and Adult Amateur 2'6" and 2'9" Hunter Divisions.

Hack Division

As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 – Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303.

Adult Equitation On the Flat and Over Fences

(Eligibility as per EC Rules)

In the 2025 EC Rule Book, the guide for junior ages is:

Junior "A" – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1st.

Junior "B" – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1st.

Junior "C" – a rider who is under 12 on January 1st.

Junior "A" Riders may not ride "B" or "C" ponies.

Junior "B" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

Junior "C" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows:

"A" ponies – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2 hands

"B" ponies – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2 hands

"C" ponies – do not exceed 12.2 hands

Trillium "A" Equitation Over Fences – Open to Large Pony Division riders with fences at 2'9"; Children's Division riders with fences at 3'; and Trillium Low/High division riders with fences at 3'3". In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form and at the ingate.

Trillium "B" and "C" Equitation Over Fences - Open to small ponies with fences at 2'3", medium ponies with fences at 2'6", large ponies at 2'9" and horses at 3'.

Adult Equitation – Adult equitation riders must be amateurs.

A horse or pony ridden in an equitation class over fences, or in the jumper medal class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.

In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

SILVER MEDAL CLASSES

My First Medal (Open to Short Stirrup Riders only)

Modified Pony Medal

2'3"/2'6" Low/High Children's Medal

2'3"/2'6" Low/High Adult Medal

2'9" Modified Children's Medal

2'9" Modified Adult Medal

3'0" Children's Medal

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for the particular medal.

Trillium Jumper Medal (.90 M and 1.0 M)ddin

This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only and competitors will have the option to compete at either .90M or 1.0M. This class has a jumping phase with the flat phase at the judge's discretion. Jumping phase to be ridden first. Additional testing options are also at the judge's discretion. If there are two phases, the medal will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. No standing martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative coloured headgear (As per Article G1109) with no additional adornment. Stirrups are restricted as per Article G1109-G).

Jumping Phase – The jumping phase should be over an equitation type course of at least nine (9) fences. Fences will not exceed .90M in height with a spread not to exceed the height. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course.

Flat Phase – At the judge's discretion, all riders, or a maximum of 12 who complete the jumping phase, may be called back to perform on the flat and demonstrate tests on the flat of the judge's choosing. The top four (4) riders in the flat phase may then be asked to complete a short test including fences determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

SILVER JUMPER DIVISIONS

Open to all horses and ponies. Maximum spread 1 M. Run under Table A.

2’3” Open Hunter Division – Fences 2’3”

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. **A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition on the same day (G201.2(c)).**

2’6” Open Small Hunter Division – Fences 2’6”

Limited to horses (14.3 – 15.3 hh). No ponies. Rated Bronze and heights will be set at 2’6” on an 11 ft stride. This division will be run as a pilot for 2026. Verification of your horse's height will be required with your entry into this division and can be uploaded to ESM with your vaccination certificates.

BRONZE JUMPER CLASSES DIVISIONS

0.65 M Jumper Division

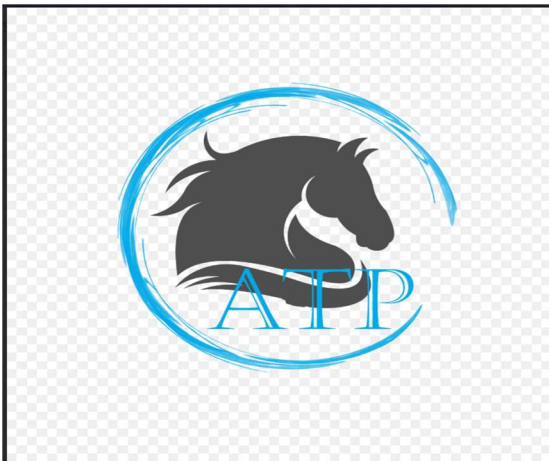

When this test is being held, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

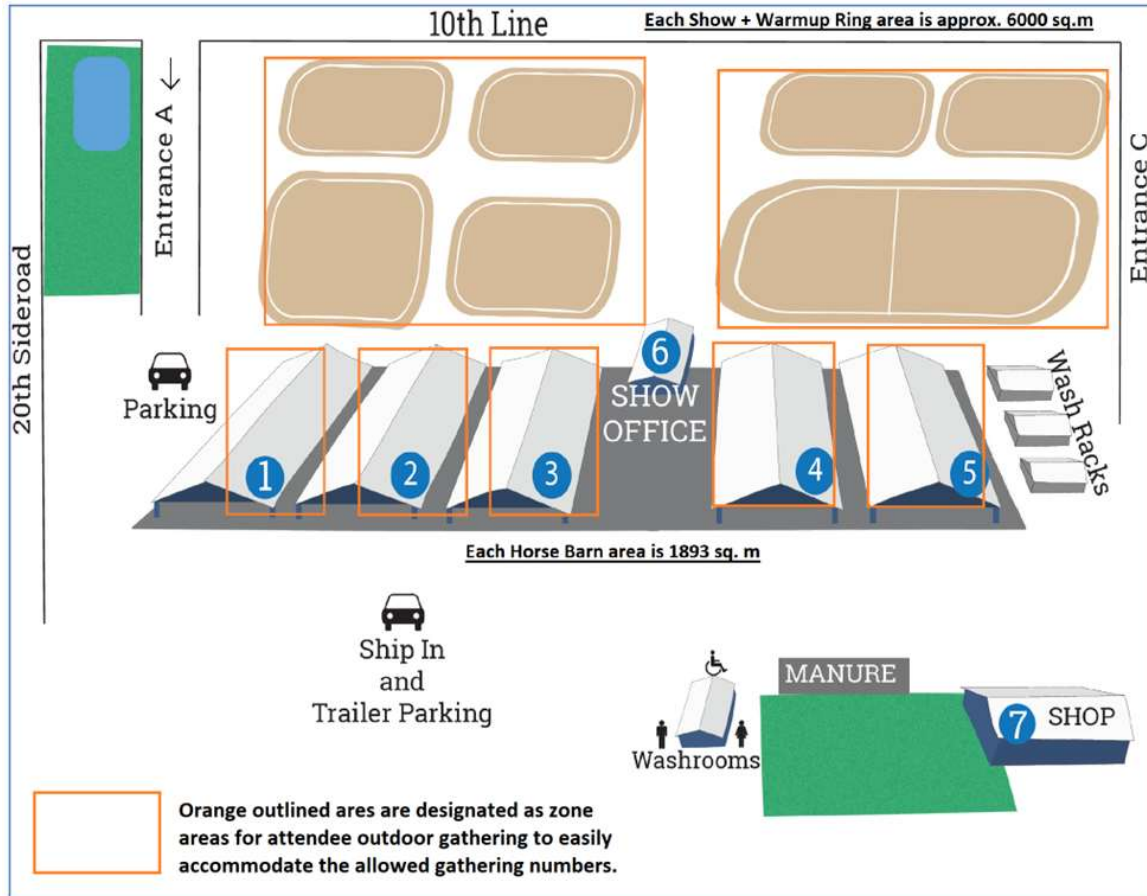
