## Rules & Regulations – Equestrian Canada

The Central Classic at Essa Trillium Shows are EC Sanctioned Silver/Bronze competitions under Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sports 2451 Riverside Dr, Ottawa ON K1H 7X7 and are governed by the rules of EC.

### **EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES**

Equestrian Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities. · Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subject to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents use responsible care in handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which the conduct or treatment of horses will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane. A medical attendant will be present at each THJA-GBZ show. A veterinarian and blacksmith will be on call.

(A102.9) When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

(A602.2) Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC Rules and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book all questions not covered by these rules shall be decided by the show management, whose decision will be final.

(A602.4) Canadian entries are required to hold both an EC Horse Recording Number and have paid the Horse Recording Annual Activation fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport license hold, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A404)

(A602.5) Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location.

(A602.7) Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC, and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals' participation in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any other additional rules imposed by the competition.

(A602.8) All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations

## Rules & Regulations: Administration

**STALL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE** after being booked.

**Entries** are to be completed online at [www.eqshowmanager.com](http://www.eqshowmanager.com) Entries are due 14 days before the horse show to avoid a post entry fee.

All entries must have a complete name and addresses for riders and owners, their respective EC (Silver or Bronze Memberships), OE and THJA numbers, horse recording numbers and **Trainer's Name and Contact Information (new for 2025)**. *Management reserves the right to refuse an entry, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries of any exhibitor at its discretion.*

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide proof of all necessary memberships (Equestrian Canada (Silver/Bronze), Ontario Equestrian and Trillium Hunter Jumper Association) for rider, owner, and horse.

**EC Temporary Sport Licences & Horse Recording Numbers:** Will no longer be sold in the show office. Competitors, Owners and Coaches are responsible for purchasing the correct level of EC membership and provide proof, if requested. Failure to have the correct level of EC membership (that the horse is being shown in - Bronze or Silver) may result in not being able to compete at the show. EC memberships should be purchased through the individual's My EC Account.

***Memberships for HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER MUST be purchased in order to compete at an event. Failure to comply with this can result in fines from Equestrian Canada for both the event and the competitor/owner and not being allowed to compete at the show.***

**Show Schedule:** Show management reserves the right to change or amend show schedules up to one hour prior to the designated class. Show management reserves the right to combine divisions at any time. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes or divisions in an effort to adhere to the timetable.

**Competitor numbers** will **NOT** be issued without full payment, or a signed open cheque left with the show secretary to cover all charges and fees incurred by the exhibitor. Competition Numbers must be worn and visible at all times when mounted on a horse.

**Outstanding accounts:** Any outstanding account for Two Stride Show Management for the Central Classic at Essa Trillium Shows must be paid in full before an entry can be accepted and processed. All accounts must be settled before the next show, otherwise, entries will be denied at the next show, and no points awarded. **\*\*\*Please note that any outstanding accounts at year-end will not be eligible to receive year-end awards.**

**Scratched Entries:** Scratched entries will pay the full Scratch Fee (\$25) plus the Administrative Fee if the scratched entry is received before the start of the hunter division or the jumper/equitation class. Failure to do this will result in **FULL ENTRY FEES BEING CHARGED.**

**Hor Concours:** Will not be permitted.

**Vaccinations:** All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. **All competitors must be able to show the proof of vaccinations upon request and vaccinations certificates for horses can be uploaded directly onto the ESM site.**

**Veterinarian and/or Farrier bills** incurred at the horse show (medical emergencies, farm calls, etc.) must be settled preferably the day the costs are incurred, but no later than 2 weeks after the event. All unpaid bills to the series "On-call Veterinarian" will result in an outstanding account for the competitor, thus the competitor will not be able to compete at any other Central Trillium show until the account has been paid in full.

**Stabling** is limited and must be arranged directly with the individual show facility. Cross ties are not permitted in aisle ways. Stable request forms **MUST** be sent into **30 days** before the show to [twostrideshowmgmt@gmail.com](mailto:twostrideshowmgmt@gmail.com) Phone or Online stall requests **WILL NOT** be considered received without the Stall Request Form, which is available for download online at [www.twostride.ca](http://www.twostride.ca).

**Stall Cleaning Fee** - A \$60.00 + HST fee will be charged to ALL exhibitors whose stall is not cleaned before departure

of the show.

**Facility/Medic Fee** - \$35.00/horse. This fee covers extra precautionary measures set in place to keep our people and competitors safe throughout day-to-day operations during competitions.

**NSF cheques** - \$50.00 bank penalty charges will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.

**Campers – Free. NO HOOK-UPS available.**

**Ribbons** - Ribbons are the responsibility of the competitor, not show management. Ribbons will be available via presentation or at the ingate any time on the SAME DAY of competition ONLY. Ribbons will not be held. Please do not collect ribbons that do not belong to you.

## Amateur Ruling:

### ARTICLE G108 Amateur Status

1. All Seniors competing in amateur classes at EC sanctioned competitions must possess a current EC amateur card, which is purchased annually at the price listed in the EC Schedule of Fees. Competitors in FEI sanctioned competitions must comply with the FEI definition of amateur.
2. A person competing in an EC amateur class must hold a valid EC senior sport license, have a current amateur card, and adhere to the following guidelines:
  - a) An EC amateur may hold an EC Instructor Beginner Certificate and teach within the context of the Instructor Beginner Certificate.
  - b) An EC amateur may accept remuneration for the instruction or coaching of the disabled.
  - c) An EC amateur may not accept remuneration for training a horse or for riding a horse at any EC sanctioned competition.
  - d) An EC amateur may not accept remuneration for coaching any person to ride or drive a horse including riding or driving clinics and seminars (See article G108 2.a for exemption)
  - e) An EC amateur may not train or show a horse or instruct a rider or driver when remuneration for this activity is given to a corporation or farm which he or she or his or her family owns or controls.
  - f) An EC amateur may not act as an agent nor accept commissions for the sale, purchase, and/or lease of a horse.
  - g) EC amateurs may not use their name, photograph or any form of personal association as a horse person in connection with any advertisement or article sold without the approval and the signature of EC (e.g. product endorsement or advertisement of their activity as a coach).
  - h) An EC amateur may not enter into any form of the sponsorship agreement. This is in conflict with the provisions of this article. See division rules for further information governing amateur status within divisions.
  - (i) Persons who have not engaged in any of the activities in Article G108 (2 a, g) during the preceding two (2) calendar years may request reinstatement as amateur competitors.
3. Application for EC amateur status:  
Amateur Status is issued by EC
  - a) For EC members, certification of amateur status is issued annually on EC sport license cards.
  - b) All people wishing EC amateur status must complete and sign the amateur declaration, which is on the
  - c) sport license application/renewal form, affirming their eligibility.Eligible amateurs who are not members of EC may receive amateur status issued by EC upon payment of fees listed in the current EC fee schedule.

## Temporary Sport Licences for 2025

Temporary Sport Licences for Competitors will no longer be issued by the Show Office. ALL riders, owners, and coaches MUST hold at minimum a Bronze Sport Licence (exceptions only in Article A213) and must be purchased on the individual's My EC Portal.

**REMINDER:** If you are showing in Silver Rated Divisions at our shows the rider and owner MUST hold Silver EC memberships in order to accumulate points towards the Trillium Championships

**\*\*\*NEW FOR 2025:** Temporary Horse Recording will NO LONGER BE AVAILABLE IN 2025. Horses showing in Silver Rated Divisions and higher are required to have a HORSE RECORDING NUMBER purchased from Equestrian Canada in order to be eligible for points for both the Trillium Championships and Year End Awards and not incur fees from Equestrian Canada.

**Memberships for HORSE, RIDER AND OWNER MUST be purchased in order to compete at an event. Failure to comply with this can result in fines from Equestrian Canada for both the event and the competitor/owner and not being allowed to compete at the show.**

## EC Coach Status Requirements for 2025

Minimum coaching requirements will be validated for all entries at EC-sanctioned events (ARTICLE A602):

- Canadian coaches must hold a minimum *Licensed EC Coach Status* to coach at an EC-sanctioned competition.
- Registered coaches, coaches listed as "Pending", "Expired", or with no status must purchase Temporary Coach Status.
- Athletes may declare themselves to be Self-Coached by entering their own name and EC Sport Licence in the trainer fields made available on the entry form.
- Temporary Coach Status purchases are DIGITAL. Any coaches purchasing Temporary Coach Statuses **MUST** do so on their My EC Portal.

## EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

# SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

**IMPORTANT CHANGES** have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

### SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

### DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

### AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

### COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

### EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

### Division & Class Specifications for 2025

#### SILVER HUNTER DIVISIONS

##### **Small Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'3"**

Open to ponies not exceeding 12.2hh. Small pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the competition year.

##### **Medium Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'6"**

Open to ponies exceeding 12.2 hh but not exceeding 13.2 hh. Medium pony riders must be 14 years of age and under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the competition year.

##### **Large Pony Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"**

Open to ponies exceeding 13.2hh but not exceeding 14.2hh. Large pony riders must be 17 years of age and under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the competition year.

##### **Modified Pony Hunter**

Open to all ponies. Ponies will jump 3" below their regular pony hunter division height and distances will be adjusted according to pony size as per EC Rules G306.6.A. Age restrictions as per EC Rules G306.1. Pony/rider combinations may not cross enter into any other classes or divisions requiring them to jump with the exception of the Modified Pony Medal and their age respective equitation on the flat.

Small – Not to exceed 2'

Medium – Not to exceed 2'3"

Large – Not to exceed 2'6"

**Every pony entered in a pony division must have a valid Equestrian Canada pony measurement on file with Equestrian Canada. USEF pony measurement cards are also acceptable.**

##### **Short Stirrup Division: Fences not to exceed 21" (Verticals Only)**

Open to "C" riders. Open to both horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted. Riders may not enter any other classes except for "C" Equitation on the flat and My First Medal. Riders in the under-saddle class must be short stirrup eligible.

##### **Adult Amateur Divisions**

All adult amateurs must possess a current EC amateur card which is purchased annually.

Adult amateurs may ride horses or large ponies. Please note that a pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2)

##### **Adult Amateur Hunter: Fences 3'**

As per Equestrian Canada Article G309. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

##### **2'9" Adult Amateur Hunter Division: Fences 2'9"**

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9 adult medal, and adult equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

### **2'3"/2'6" Low/High Adult Amateur Hunter Division**

Open to adult amateur riders on horses and large ponies. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6" and under. If also competing in the low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Medal and adult equitation on the flat. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

**Junior Divisions** - Open to horses ridden by juniors.

### **2'3"/2'6" Low/High Children's Hunter Division**

Open to junior riders on horses and ponies. A pony ridden by an adult cannot be shown by a junior at the same competition (G201.2). Distances will not be adjusted. Riders may compete in any eligible division with a height 2'6" and under. If also competing in the low/high open hunter division, they are only eligible to compete at the 2'6" (low) height. Horse/rider combinations are also permitted to show in the hack division, age-appropriate equitation on the flat and the 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Medal. Competitors may move up or down a height throughout the season but cannot change heights at an individual show.

### **2'9' Children's Hunter Division:**

A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into the hack division, the low/high open hunter division, the 2'9' children's medal, and age-appropriate equitation on the flat class. Riders may enter any other division or class at that show on another horse or pony. The horse may be shown in another class/division with another rider.

### **Children's Hunter: Fences 3'0"**

As per Equestrian Canada Rules Article G307. Riders in this division may cross enter to the Low Hunter and the Trillium Hunter Division at 3'3".

### **Open Divisions**

#### ***Low/High Open Hunter Division: Fences 2'6" and 2'9"***

Open to all horses. No ponies are permitted. Horse/rider combinations may only cross enter to divisions requiring them to jump 2'9" and under, hack division, and their age-appropriate equitation on the flat. Competitors may move both up and down in heights between shows, but competitors may not change heights once the division has started. *Competitors must declare height on their Championship Show Entry Form.*

Note: 2'3"/2'6" Low High Adult Amateur Hunter and 2'3"/2'6" Low High Children's Hunter competitors may only jump at the 2'6" height in this division.

#### **Low Hunter: Fences 3'**

Open to all horses and riders.

#### **Trillium Hunter – Low/High: Fences 3'3" and 3'6"**

The low option of this division is open to all eligible riders. This division is not open to riders competing in the Children's 2'6" and 2'9" and Adult Amateur 2'6" and 2'9" Hunter Divisions.

#### **Hack Division**

As per Equestrian Canada Chapter 12 and 13 – Classes Refer to Article G1301-1303.

**Adult Equitation On the Flat and Over Fences**

(Eligibility as per EC Rules)

*In the 2025 EC Rule Book, the guide for junior ages is:*

Junior "A" – a rider who is 15, 16, 17 on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

Junior "B" – a rider who is 12, 13, 14 on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

Junior "C" – a rider who is under 12 on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

Junior "A" Riders may not ride "B" or "C" ponies.

Junior "B" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

Junior "C" Riders may ride "A", "B", or "C" ponies.

*For show purposes, ponies are to be divided as follows:*

"A" ponies – over 13.2 hands, but not to exceed 14.2 hands

"B" ponies – over 12.2 hands, but not to exceed 13.2 hands

"C" ponies – do not exceed 12.2 hands

**Trillium "A" Equitation Over Fences** – Open to Large Pony Division riders with fences at 2'9"; Children's Division riders with fences at 3'; and Trillium Low/High division riders with fences at 3'3". In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

**Trillium "B" and "C" Equitation Over Fences** - Open to small ponies with fences at 2'3", medium ponies with fences at 2'6", large ponies at 2'9" and horses at 3'.

**Adult Equitation** – Adult equitation riders must be amateurs.

A horse or pony ridden in an equitation class over fences, or in the jumper medal class may only be ridden in that class by one rider.

In the event a rider competes in two different divisions requiring them to jump different heights, it will be their choice which height they will jump for the equitation over fences class. This choice needs to be indicated on the entry form.

## **SILVER MEDAL CLASSES**

**My First Medal (Open to Short Stirrup Riders only)**

**Modified Pony Medal**

**2'3"/2'6" Low/High Children's Medal**

**2'3"/2'6" Low/High Adult Medal**

**2'9" Modified Children's Medal**

**2'9" Modified Adult Medal**

**3'0" Children's Medal**

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Trillium Medal Class has evolved into a specialty class unique to the Trillium Circuit. Where a contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equestrian Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course. Eligibility as per individual hunter division specs for the particular medal.

**First Phase** - Over Fences: Figure eight course of not less than eight jumps. Class is judged in accordance with Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional tests over fences are permitted.

Second Phase - On The Flat: All contestants, or a minimum of ten shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot, and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

Scoring: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005 (Equestrian Canada Rule Book Section G)

## **SILVER JUMPER DIVISIONS**

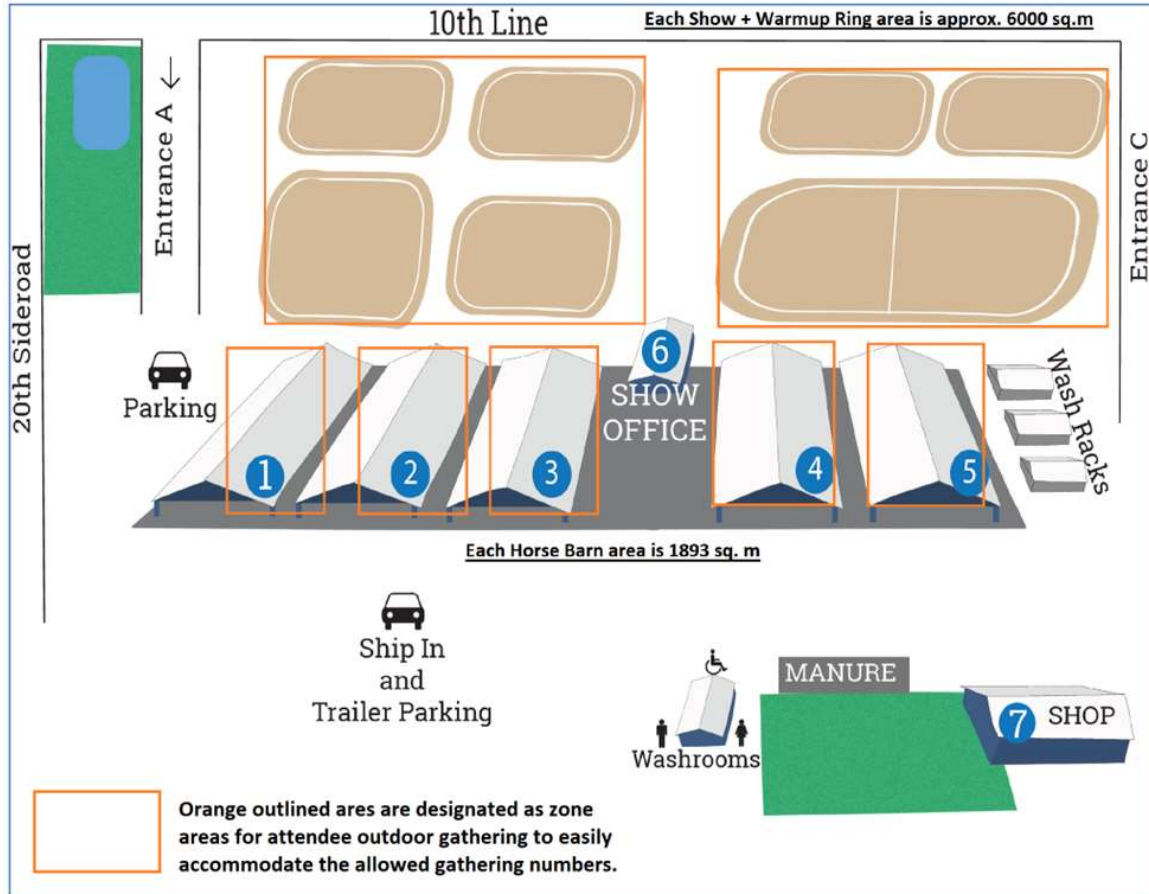
